Local Sites Earmarked for New Houses in Crosspool

In order to meet government housing targets, Sheffield Council has outlined plans to build new homes on Lydgate Reservoir in Crosspool, Hadfield Service Reservoir in Crookes and Canterbury Crescent in Fulwood.

The Lydgate Reservoir is located at the top of Evelyn Road, a quiet cul-de-sac of Ryegate Cres. It is thought that once the reservoir has been decommissioned, Yorkshire Water will market the site sometime between 2017 or 2022.

One Evelyn Road resident. David Smithson, said: "If this pleasant and quiet cul-de-sac were to be the sole access to this site. the prospects of an unacceptable increase in traffic, and the resultant noise pollution, would have detrimental consequence on me and my neighbours' health and wellbeing. Twenty new dwellings would probably mean thirty or more cars added to usage of the road.



These sites are three of eighteen in Sheffield earmarked as part of a strategy to build 1.110 new homes.

The council is asking for residents and businesses to comment, on the plans for potential new housing, before the 27th February 2012. People can view the proposals/plans at libraries and First Point offices and at www.sheffield.gov.uk/sdfconsult. 

Permission Granted for a New House

Councillors have granted permission for a new three-bedroomed townhouse in the garden of a property on Headland Drive. The applicant agreed to revise the design of the proposed house on the advice of officers, following concerns that it failed to pick up the distinctive characteristics of the street.

The revised scheme as submitted is considered to be acceptable from a design perspective and successfully picks up on the architectural qualities of the neighbouring properties.

The proposed house would incorporate a feature bay window to reflect the style of neighbouring properties and be constructed with a hipped roof and faced in materials to match the existing properties in the area.

It would be sited on the alignment of the adjacent pair of semis to reflect the building line of the street.

Crosspool's Almost Hidden Gem Stone

A hundred and fifty years ago when Pawson & Brailsford published their first-ever ' Illustrated Guide to Sheffield and Neighbourhood' its content included, among descriptions of some surrounding districts, those of Rivelin, Ribbledin, and Wyming Brook.

Commencing at Broomhill Toll Bar the hiker would walk up the Glossop Turnpike road towards "a little hamlet" (Crosspool) passing en route "the wayside Inn, 'King Stephen", a pause, and then onwards for refreshment at the 'Belhag' inn. Back on the road again and now strolling downhill towards the Rivelin Mill Bridge, passing on the way the "third milestone", the second one being in Crosspool.

As only the upper half of this local gem from the past - its inscribed distance measurements from there to Sheffield and to Manchester now rapidly fading - remains, I don't propose for obvious reasons pin-pointing its exact location, By Acts of Parliament it - and every Milestone, once placed had to remain in-situ for all time.

Bollards installed on Stephen Hill Road Verges

Bollards have been installed on Stephen Hill Road verges. Crosspool residents recently requested measures to prevent vehicles from diving on the grass verge and pavement next to the Manchester Road doctors surgery.

On 23 November, the council installed a number of strategically placed bollards across the pavement and grass verge on Stephen Hill Road.

It is hoped that these measures will eliminate the potential danger of injury to pedestrians, and in so doing make this stretch of pavement a safer place for small children and the older members of the community.



20MPH SPEED LIMIT AREA CONSULTATIONS

20's Plenty



Local consultation meetings arranged by the South West Community Assembly let Members of the public feed into the process their thoughts on what areas should be a priority. Where People Live Highways and Road Safety Officers

presented information on the proposed 20mph areas and were on hand to answer questions.

A report is being prepared for the Cabinet Highways Committee in March or April 2012 on a strategy for delivery of a city-wide 20mph limit, and how to prioritise areas, starting with those around schools. The report will also consider how it would be feasible to tie the required work in with the Highways PFI. Further Consultation with local communities about implementation of 20 mph areas will begin after the strategy has been approved. Preparation of the strategy will also include development of a set of resources to be used for local 'hearts and minds' campaigns.

Crosspool Petrol Station Seeks Permission to Install Jet Wash

The petrol station on Manchester Road in Crosspool has applied for planning permission install a iet wash with shelter on the side of the existing building.

Planning application 11/03549/FUL describes how the new facility would be built to the right hand side of the Mace store.

It would be enclosed on three sides with Perspex sheets supported by steel columns, with a roof.

In response to automatic teller machine (ATM) scams across our region, such as that which occurred recently at the ATM on Sandygate Road Crosspool, where, a number of accounts were found to have been hacked. Cash machine operator LINK has teamed up with independent charity Crimestoppers, to offer rewards of up to £25,000 for information related to cash machine crimes.

Working closely with different police agencies and departments, including the dedicated cheque and plastic crime unit (DCPCU) - a banking industry-sponsored special police unit - the partnership aims to support the police in their fight against crime and help inform the public about how they can protect themselves.

Any information you may have about this sort of crime, card skimming or physical attacks on cash machines, even something that may sound insignificant could be part of a bigger picture, and prove invaluable in convicting someone involved in cash machine crime."

the oldest football ground in the world, has been improved with refurbished clubhouse and dressing rooms, the relaying of paths inside the ground, new barriers and work to the pitch.

Speaking on Radio Sheffield, chairman David Slater said: "We think we've got the best ground in the Northern Counties League. There are some wonderful places that have had Football Foundation grant aid but we're very proud of what we've done and match up to anybody. People come from over the world to see us. We have to keep that ground spick and span as it is now."

The work was paid for by an unexpected donation in his will by long term Countrymen fan Roger Bell.

Special guests will oversee the official opening at 1pm on Friday, 13 April.

Open Meeting 26th January <

Fifty Crosspool residents, our three local councillors (Cllr. Sylvia Anginotti, Cllr. Brian Holmes, &

Cllr. Geoff Smith) and 8 members of the forum management committee, attended.

Five Guest speakers gave presentations as follows:

Local Land release Consultation; Sarah Smith (Sheffield City Council Planning Dept.)

In order to fulfil its obligations to the Government, with regard to releasing Brownfield land for houses as Yorkshire Water has decommissioned Lydgate Reservoir (off Evelyn Rd), Hadfield Service Reservoir & Canterbury Crescent, the Council is seeking residents' views on allowing these sites (among others throughout the city) to be developed for housing. Two drop –in sessions - Thurs 2nd Feb (3pm-8prn) at Stephen Hill Methodist Church, and Fri 3rd Feb (2pm-7pm) Hallam Primary School- have been arranged for viewing the consultation documents. Comments to Planning in writing please, - emails, online via Sheffield City Council, or by post.

Police report; PC Louise Atha said that in April the boundaries will be changing, so she and her colleagues from Broomhill SNA will be dealing with Crosspool and Lodge Moor - from the bottom of Manchester Rd west (with Broomhill itself becoming part of the city centre). She reported on more Allotment break-ins and the re-opening of Operation Herbaceous to deal with this. There are still Scrap-metal dealers cruising about and she is able to prosecute those without licences.

There have been a few burglaries in the Sandygate area with the object being to steal car keys and thus the cars. Please ensure you keep your property locked! PCSO Garry Hizam showed a new device, the Hermes unit (laptop & scanner) which will allow any mobile unit to scan possibly stolen mobile phones etc. and return them to their registered owners. The Police Box on Lydgate Lane will be open for people to bring their mobiles etc in for registration - 9th Feb (6pm-7pm).

Queries from the floor included speeding cars in Marsh Lane & Lydgate Lane, evening doorstep cold-callers (legitimate?) and a local mugging incident. PC Louise Atha was eager for any information on any of the above to be reported to her immediately.

Greg Challis from Traffic & Highways took the floor, as liaison officer for the SWCA They will not know their allocation of funds for this year until April, and receive more requests for traffic schemes than they have the money to implement them. Residents will have noticed the dropped kerbs, tactile paving etc. his team have put down, but for each scheme proposed he needs to look at issues of conflict between traffic, parking needs, residents, and legal matters.

As regards the Benty Lane junction problem, he has studied the accident record for the last five years, and has seen a cluster of them, none serious but higher than expected. He wants to look at removing any conflicting manoeuvres, before thinking about big engineering solutions, mini roundabouts, traffic lights, road closures etc. The root of the problem is the large volume of through traffic using the Manchester Rd, so is there a way of encouraging vehicles to use a different route? (Ian H. suggested the Hillsborough long-lasting tram works caused a lot of people to discover this way to cross the city, & reckoned there was a near miss every day). Greg pointed out that the white markings designating a slip junction for cars to wait to turn right down Stephen Hill protects the cars & eases the flow past them, but also formalizes the turn, possibly encouraging more cars to go this way, and end up on what becomes a country lane. He asked for any suggestions. Ian J. pointed out a major sightline problem for Benty Lane exiting cars, in both directions (extended DYLs are needed). Faye said pedestrians also find crossing Stephen Hilt difficult, and a lot of school children use this route. Although there has been no fatality within 5 years, there have been in the past. (Greg agreed pointing out safety issues for pedestrians was essential).

The heavy Lorries (often in convoys) coming from or going towards Derwent, ought to be stopped and Greg said a report is due out soon on preferred HGV routes across the whole city and e.g. to the MI, but pointed out the road is an 'A' road after all. Certainly some Lorries (satnavs) use Hagg Hill etc. as the main route to/from Hillsborough, which can cause major problems.

Smiley Sids' portable road speed monitors are available and could be erected (using these for short periods only, does slow vehicles down). SWCA's two are in use elsewhere at the moment.

Residents can send in their suggestions online or by completing a form. These can also be downloaded, but Greg has taken note of the comments at this meeting. There were also questions from the floor such as why there is a 40mph speed limit on Manchester Rd, and whether people parking on Benty Lane do so because they are residents, local shoppers, or commute into the centre, why there are so few bollards along Marsh Lane to prevent verge parking and better warning signage was suggested. Internet & Personal Safety; PC Joy Price, (Children & Young Persons Officer, Broomhill SNA) spoke about the dangers of social networking sites, and parental responsibilities to ensure all possible locks, safeguards and filters are active on their home computers and other internet devices - such as X boxes, Wii and Play Stations. She felt Blackberry phones in particular were very dangerous and should not be in children's hands. The sorts of slight disagreements which used to mean a brief verbal argument and short-lived physical tussle at school are now carried out online, by anonymous/authored verbal abuse, which ends up as a vicious circle that can't easily be stopped. Parents must ensure under-13s cannot start a Facebook account, and do not post personal & intimate details about themselves — and photos too - on line. The internet is a candy-shop for paedophiles, as well as giving violent partners and estranged parents a means of access to their ex's and kids. Certain sites such as Chat Roulette or Formspring are to be avoided at all cost, and parents were urged only to use reputable websites such as those the BBC links to, for homework etc. The grooming of unsuspecting youngsters, and radicalization of young people in the` security' of their own bedrooms was touched upon, and Joy concluded by saying we must remember -THE INTERNET IS ANOTHER STREET, WHERE YOU HAVE TO WATCH YOUR BACK



Concessionary Confusion

A rumour that free off peak rail travel for Sheffield concessionary travel pass holders is to stop is not true says SYPTE

Concessionary pass holders travelling from South Yorkshire into West Yorkshire will still be able to travel free of charge - despite advice issued by West Yorkshire authorities, and contrary to information being put out by staff in Sheffield station ticket office.

The Star carried a report from West Yorkshire Metro, which oversees transport in areas including Leeds. Wakefield and Huddersfield, advising that from January 2 concessionary pass holders from areas other than West Yorkshire would no longer be entitled to a discount on trains. And despite subsequent denials, as recently as the end of January, local residents were still being told the scheme was about to end.

But in response to our enquiries. South Yorkshire Passenger Transport Executive, which funds travel passes in Sheffield, said the arrangement to cover the cost of free off-peak train journeys into West Yorkshire will continue.

Morris Shapiro, SYPTE Concessions & Ticketing Services Manager said: "The position with South Yorkshire issued English National Concessionary passes has not changed. These passes may be used on rail journeys to and from West Yorkshire, on Northern Rail only, and provided that there is no change of train in West Yorkshire. I am sorry that there has been some confusion which started when West Yorkshire changed the rail concession for holders of West Yorkshire issued passes."
