

### "Prove yourself worth dying for, and your dog, if need be, will cheerfully make the sacrifice"

WHEREAS, on December 12th, just past, weather wise we enjoyed, following icy conditions and a powdering of snow the previous day, long and very welcome spells of sunshine, despite the temperatures hovering in the region of zero, and blustery winds.... It was a totally different day on December 12th, 1953 when, nearing the end one of the mildest periods for twenty years, it was fine too, cloudless, and a good portend for 86 years-old sheep farmer (oft Trials winner and former shepherd in the employ of His Grace, the Duke of Norfolk) Joseph Tagg, accompanied by his faithful sheepdog, 'Tip', to once again make one of his regular



visits to inspect his flock of sheep which he pastured at Pike Low, some distance up the lovely Derwent Valley. Side by side, Joe and 'Tip', a highly respected partnership in the Competition 'field', left their home in the Ashopton area on a very familiar routine, starting with a walk up to and crossing the busy A57, followed by a stroll up the Valley to the grazing area. As regular as clockwork the pair passed, at about 1.20 p.m., the Abbey Cottage and minutes later vanishing out of sight.

As they ambled along one can imagine that, from time to time, the lovingly brushed and combed, eleven years old "Tip' gently, affectionately as was her manner, rubbed against Joe's trousers and he always responded by giving her a friendly 'pat' or two and, while doing so, he accompanied that gesture by uttering words which she did not understand, but felt that they were intended to confirm the many years the 'Man and his dog' had bonded so very well, and how vital that was! You've guessed, that exchange brought much wagging of 'Tip's' tail. Presently, the flock was reached and so, meticulously, Joseph inspected his sheep, one by one, looking for any signs of disease, blood stains, a certain sign that the ewe had been attacked by another animal, maybe from a wound inflicted by an uncontrolled dog, a member of a pack of such wanderers. 'Tip', too, doubtless would have had her own 'inspection. Hopefully, satisfied all was well, Joe's next and very important task was to check the boundary wall and fences simply because there are criminal fraternities quite prepared to drive a vehicle in and, without any compunction, steel a few sheep. No damage, disease or any sheep gone a.w.a.l. Good visit.

All done, time to return home for Joe and 'Tip' and, here again, the pair could be timed making their way, walking down the valley or, if the 'local' reservoir trippers bus was running that day, have a ride to near their home.

That particular day, there simply was no sighting of either Joseph or of 'Tip' and that was so very strange and out of the ordinary, that more or less immediately the alarm was raised. Why, what was wrong, where were the pair? All knew that, despite his advancing years, the eighty-six year old shepherd was fit enough to carry out his frequent visits to check all was well, so something most decidedly was amiss.

Without any hesitation, soon a number of relatives, farmers and ramblers who were familiar with the terrain frequented by Joseph and 'Tip' had assembled and so began the first of many, many widening searches of the Valley. Some lasted from 'dawn' to 'dusk' and not a 'stone was left untouched, as the 'hunt' pressed on relentlessly. Alas, and heart-aching for the Family, as was to be expected, not a single of the volunteers searchers was able to bring any news that would give rise to hope of finding the pair on the moors beyond the Howden Reservoir. Rugged it is out there and bleak at the best of times, but now, with the onset of winter, things certainly did not augur well. A very serious and unpromising situation had to be faced and a decision made about further searching of the moorland areas. ...read on

It was, therefore, with great reluctance that December 21st (weather permitting) would see the very last scouring. It was a combined and highly organised attempt to find Joseph and 'Tip' and involved, apart from members of the family, friends, hikers, experienced ramblers, all kinds of volunteers, the police and members of the Buxton Rescue Teams. In all nearly 200 people were out looking everywhere possible; not any 'stone was left unturned'. Despite all their efforts simply negative was the result.

Strangely the search came just in time because during the 1953 Christmas period, snow fell on several days and so that put an end to any further mass efforts for quite some time. January brought further snow falls, and coupled with sleet, they were widespread during the early days of the month. It was bitterly cold with severe frosts. Not searching sort of conditions and, of course, it had been left to the hardy ramblers who could endure such, to keep a wary eye out.

February followed a similar pattern and it was not until early in March any milder break came. It was nearing the end of the month that a Derwent Valley Water Board employee, Mr. Sam Bingham, who knew Joe very well, made the three months long awaited 'discovery', that was on the 27th of the month. Bearing in mind all the conditions of the past 105 days, the presence of variously-sized other quadrupeds and not forgetting the winged, 'ones', I personally think it prudent, in respect for the lovely much respected shepherd, to not go into details of exactly what Sam found that day, except to say Joseph Tag, now deceased and beside him, now naturally, a 'shadow of her former self' lay one who for so long had played a major part in his daily life—yes, 'Tip'. Goodness me, words just fail when the devotion to her master she had shown needs to be 'penned'. What does one say only how very, very true are the words with which this article is headed? For, be assured, the 'One' who had given Joe his rest would certainly not have let 'Tip' display her love, loyalty and so great an affection for Joe much longer and she too, would, blessedly, have closed those big, and caring eyes forever! Eves which, if she could have spoken, would have told a totally absorbing story of her fight against hunger. keeping away unwanted visitors; the vain efforts she made, believing Joe just to be asleep, to awaken him, pressing her only just warm body against his to infuse a spark of heat; 'nosing', frequently his tightly clasped and icv hands; if only her friend would answer. Her eyes must have whetted many times as she so missed the high-pitched whistle call of commands Joe used to issue on trial days, his tender words of bonding. All was so still with her master, no movement, and absolute silence. How much she must have fretted no one will know. She just longed and longed for life to return to her 'pal', but 'twas never to be and soon it was to be her well and much deserved turn to be love and cared for by so many who could not fail to be moved by her action.

Following the discovery, Sam naturally made his way back to Derwent for help and, one assumes, the presence of a police Forensic team to thoroughly inspect the area of the find. Carefully and gently both Joe and 'Tip' were removed from their 'home' for the past three months. Exactly why the shepherd should have ventured a further four miles beyond his land will never be known; the true reason died with him, but many believe he had a premonition that this was to be the very last chance that he would have of visiting the site of the farm where he was born and brought up and which premises were demolished in 1909 - 1910 to make way for the completion of



the far end of the Howden Reservoir. His 'roots' were in Ronksley farm, it being the furthermost of several in the West End of the Derwent Valley.

Goodness only knows how many memories must have been aroused for Joseph as silently he gazed down at the long-since waters covered spot, a farm beloved by his family and many other families who had, over centuries both lived there, tried to work the land thereabouts and bred flocks of sheep.

Permit me, here, to relate a true little story which you, dear reader, may well find humorous, but not so for the folk involved many years ago. At the various seasons of the year - Harvest, Christmas..., the then farmers, their wives and ever-rising numbers of children at Marebottom, Birchinlee Ridge, Ronksley, West End and Bank Top made time of appropriate celebrations. The women shared the task of preparing and setting out the Yorkshire Range produce - bread, cakes & home reared meats of course.. But er.., as for liquid refreshment this came out of a barrel and this dispensing was the task of the menfolk. The strong ale was brought to the little community on a horse-drawn farm cart and the route was by way of a rough truck by the side of the fast flowing River Derwent. Tragedy almost struck at one event when the cart overturned, and blow me, the barrel dropped into the water. Hearts sank, but the barrel wasn't allowed to! The action was indeed, rapid. Be assured Strong ale was served with the meal, but return to our story, and dear old 'Tip's' vigil. ...read on

In commemoration, a public subscription fund was opened and, resulting from the amount of interest and money received, it was decided to have carved on grey granite a reminder of the dog's endurance and to place the 'stone' on the footpath leading to the Howden Reservoir, running parallel to the road, and very near the Derwent Reservoir Embankment Wall. 'Tip', by the way, entered her own and much deserved rest on, or about February 20th, 1955. The inscription on the Memorial reads:

IN COMMEMORATION OF THE DEVOTION OF TIP, THE SHEEPDOG WHICH STAYED BY THE BODY OF HER DEAD MASTER, MR JOSEPH TAGG ON THE HOWDEN MOORS FOR FIFTEEN WEEKS FROM 12TH DECEMBER, 1953 TO 27TH MARCH, 1954- ERECTED BY PUBLIC SUBSCRIPTION

So, this year of 2015 marks the 60th Anniversary of the demise of a good and faithful friend, and few sheepdogs, I imagine, will have matched her record of devotion. Open Meeting 12th February 2015

Postponed from 29th January

Present: 43 Crosspool residents, Cllrs Ann Murphy & Rob Frost, guest speakers and members of the Forum Management Committee.

Apologies were received from Cllr Geoff Smith & Forum webmaster Robin Byles.

#### CHAIRMAN'S REPORT.

**Ian Hague** welcomed everyone – Thursday 29th had seen a heavy blizzard so had made holding a meeting impossible!.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT.

**Angela Southward** - the Forum bank balance is "pretty healthy" with Festival Street Market stallholders money coming in, despite insurance and calendar printing costs going out. We have broken even on the calendar – two left to sell.

#### POLICE REPORT.

**PCSO Gary Hizam** said there have been 12 cases of "interference with motor vehicles", 7 actual break-in burglaries to houses and 12 shed/garage break-ins – in the last 6 months around Crosspool. The stolen items from one house-break were recovered in a dumped vehicle after a resident's noting the car registration number – this is well worth doing!

Our PC Louise Atha will be no longer on duty round the neighbourhood, but may still attend Open meetings. The old Lydgate Lane police box has re-opened –see new flagpole with union flag!

Queries on dog walking through Crookes Cemetery (bylaws say this is illegal) and grass verge parking were brought up. Gary will look into the dog walking and the Ryegate Centre is being proactive about its staff parking on Tapton Cresc. Rd verges – please report any to them. There is a Neighbourhood Watch Meeting at Stephen Hill on 22nd April, (7-9pm) – guest speakers.

#### **AMEY (Streets Ahead) UPDATE**

Claire Tideswell said the winter weather had been challenging but they hope to get the lights, tree, and pavements done by March; then Sandygate Rd will start in late February. In Broomhill work has just started on making an extra lane for vehicles turning up Crookes. She took notes on worries about resurfaced roads having the wrong camber (Moorview Close), the collapse of the plastic barriers round the light standard holes in recent high winds, potholes in un-repaired roads (still report these to Amey), the Cairns Rd light problems (Npower & a circuit fault), reported but not cleared out gullies (Sandygate Rd/Moorbank) and grit bins. Blackbrook Rd is a different scope of works & will be totally redone — lights, pavements and highway. The Council is holding a Winter Review so issues with e.g. grit bins should be sent in to Ann Murphy. ...contd.

#### FIRST BUS COMPANY UPDATE

Andy Metcalfe & Paul Moorhouse (new 51 route manager) hoped we had noticed an improvement in the service recently - despite the snow. On "punctuality and reliability" they have "reached 90% in the last 10 days". Lessons learnt from October will be taken into consideration in any changes in late April '15. There were still complaints from the floor, but also some compliments – the service did surprisingly well during the snow. The "real time system" (electronic displays) still appears to have some problems, and Andy will look at a website called "Travel disruptions" to ensure up-to-date information is posted. Both intend to visit Lodge Moor and Vernon Terrace to see how the buses run.
