Mobile Phone Mast Application Withdrawn

Following a large number of objections from local residents and businesses to the erection of a 12.5m mobile phone monopole and base station on the land adjacent to 1 Sandygate Grange Drive, Sandygate Road; and the subsequent recognition of the land on which EE Ltd & Hutchinson 3G UK Ltd wanted to erect this, is private land and doesn't belong to the Council. As no permission would have been granted, the

SCC Chief Planning Officer has confirmed that the planning application Ref: 19/00405/TEL has now been withdrawn.

Local Cllr Tim Huggan said the Hallam Football pitch has an existing mast, and it is hoped this facility can be shared. It is a different sort of planning application in which acceptance is presumed and has to be disputed if unacceptable.

It was a last minute rush to set up this year's summer fayre due to persistent showers throughout the morning and the delayed delivery of the bouncy castle due to mechanical problems. But we managed it in the end as the skies cleared for a lovely sunny afternoon. The Fayre was



officially opened by the Rev. Suzanne Nockles, and then the fun filled entertainment followed with an upbeat performance by the ever-popular Scoil Rince Nua Irish Dancers – a rousing dance routine by the LMW Dance Troop and children's "old favourite" Barney Baloney was there with Henry getting up to his usual mischievous tricks. Musical entertainment was provided by the Ambassador Swing Band playing the sounds of Glenn Miller, and Dave Bolsover and family did a little strumming on their numerous guitars, all performing to full audiences. Holly Hagg Community Farm Alpacas were in attendance again this year, together with our first ever Llama paying us a visit. Their popularity is growing year on year with fayre visitors who love to meet and feed the delightful pack. All the traditional stalls were open; hot dogs, burgers, ice creams and WI creamed teas were consumed. Children being transformed by face painting and henna tattooed art. Later in the afternoon the 2019 Crosspool festival scarecrow com-

petition winners were presented with their prizes and the raffle winners went away happy. The buzz around the CDYST sports field didn't end there, after the close of the fayre the CDYST was then transformed into a film set for the filming of the big-screen version of "Everyone's talking about Jamie" and on the Monday afternoon the cameras were rolling as the cast and film crew were on site. Other film locations around Sheffield have been used including Deerlands Avenue and the Crookes Club since filming began on the 24th June.

Crosspool Pilot Street Light Dimming



Residents to have their say on street light dimming. Crosspool, Endcliffe and Meersbrook have been selected for the trialled dimming of street lighting levels. From Monday 19th August to Friday 13th September 2019, residents will see street lighting in these pilot areas of the city being reduced by up to an additional 14%. Households in the chosen areas will each receive a letter inviting them to attend an information session in their local library. Residents across the city will also be invited to take part in an online consultation on the proposals. The views of those in the pilot areas will then be assessed alongside the views from respondents across the city. The proposals will see street lights switch on responsively at 80% instead of the current 84% before midnight and reduce from 54% to 40% at midnight until 5am, whilst still meeting

the requirements of the current national Code of Practice. South Yorkshire Police are aware of the proposal and the council will continue to work with them, and other stakeholders, to assess and evaluate the impact on communities. Emergency services will still be able to request an increase in lighting levels, in response to certain incidents, when required. Supporting the first priority of the 2018 Green City Strategy, Sheffield has one of the most advanced street lighting systems in the UK, with the ability to vary lighting levels – even down to individual lighting columns. As a result of the Streets Ahead investment, Sheffield now has a complete network of state-of-the-art white LED street lights. In the first five years of the programme, more than 66,000 new LED street lights were installed across the city; ensuring safer and more energy-efficient light distribution. - The Plough (still an Asset of Community Value) is going to planning in September see page 11.
- The local Freemason (Tapton Hall) has been in touch and offered to help in the community nothing further has been heard.
- Shop canopy; Cllr Anne Murphy has emailed the "Inspiration" landlord to ask if he will join the others in contributing to getting this repaired.
- Rivelin Valley Water Treatment Plant officially opened by the Duke of Gloucester for security reasons, no publicity until after the event.
- Care in Crosspool now have a new coordinator. See page 10.
- Proposed CCTV cameras still work in progress a meeting is hoped to be arranged with Sheffield Council's Head of Transport & Highways Services. See page 6.
- Grass verge cutting? Apparently at the moment the cutting is done on one day and the
 cuttings collected on another by which time they can have blown into and blocked the gulleys! Some residents want them uncut to develop wildflower meadow areas.
- Precinct planters were once again planted up by King Edwards Year 8 pupils and the hanging baskets by the Benty Lane scout cubs.
- Although the former Motorworld shop and flat is now demolished, the original Lydgate Hall gatepost tops have been retrieved and placed on Lydgate Green.
- Ian reported that sadly Joe Castle, long-time resident and local historian, has died. See page 10.
- Jon Ashe, postgrad researching community forums, had some very positive feedback regarding Crosspool and it's involving all the local people.
- Ian and Steve said that they would warmly welcome stories of local interest for the Crosspool News and Clarion.

 John Drinkwater reported that the bank balance is healthy, £800 from the Crosspool Festival Week to be divided between the two chosen charities -'Ben's Centre' and the Cystic Fibrosis Unit for young adults at the NGH.





Crosspool Car Parking Issues

ivil enforcement officers now regularly visit the Crosspool precinct and check on the use of the parking spaces, especially the disabled bays, (Cllr. Murphy confirmed this was the case and said that a few cars have been ticketed). The Spar Double Yéllow Line's appear to be a hotspot for illegal parking, as is the disabled bays at the front of the chip shop and chemist. Enforcement officers have also been round the school roads with a car cam. Someone was caught parked in the Vernon Terrace Bus Loading Bay, and they spoke to several motorists about the health risks of sitting in their vehicle with the engine idling.

A number of drivers have been caught speeding by the South Yorkshire Mobile Safety Cameras, now regularly deployed monitoring motorists on the 30mph section of Manchester Road between Bell Hagg and Benty Lane.

Precinct CCTV Camera Saga

he CCTV camera proposed for the Crosspool precinct is still a work in progress. The Forum has received so many estimates over the last few years of varying amounts - the latest is that Amey wants to charge £300 approx. to erect the camera and a further £1530 approx. to pay

for the electricity for 25 years!

Cllr. Murphy has spoken to Cllr. Bob Johnson who said the next stage is to meet the Head of Transport and Highways Services to outline a plan to work with the community, the police and schools to get this working as we have a "reasonable argument" for needing this scheme in place. Anne felt the Forum should look to pay only the original £3,000. (Ian said the total for latest quote was somewhere in the region of £7k!!) The Council is the only registered official body which can erect and give authority to download the images to the police. Cllr Murphy wants to "cut through all the red tape"

A donation of £100 has been received towards the cameras from a local resident.

Charities Benefit from the Festival



Catherine Kelly (Sheffield Hospital Charity

Catherine Kelly (volunteer manager Sheffield Hospitals Charity) spoke of the Cystic Fibrosis Unit's aim to 'achieve the very best they can for their patients", and how they support people with this debilitating disease. It affects the respiratory and digestive systems, and can lead to a lot of very intensive treatment and hospital care being needed. When young people transition from the Children's Hospital to the Northern General, it can be frightening, a big adult place with a different team, so they have redeveloped their unit to provide a home from home for what can be for up to a month-long stay. The disease can be "life limiting. There are 12 isolated risk of infection beds, meaning they can't socialize so each bedroom has been decorated differently, for example; a forest, an oriental

garden, a New York loft, with places for relatives to sleep over and a dietician on hand to entice their appetites, with specially thought-out food. (Some patients are taking 55 tablets a day!) She was therefore very grateful to be presented with a £400 cheque from the Crosspool Festival by Robert Boulter husband of Dawn, last year's festival team leader, who sadly past away in the week following the 2018 festival.

On behalf of the Crosspool Festival Robert Boulter was delighted to hand a cheque for £400 to Ian (Ben) Sherman who was a founder member of the Ben's Centre in Sheffield in 1996. Ian Sherman thanked everyone for this donation to their charity, and said during his 23 years as a Town Hall policeman he had become very aware of the problem with drunks in the Peace Gardens. The old cycle of arrest, cells, court appearance, then back out again was not working, and as there were all sorts of people - from plumbers to company directors - feeling this was all they could do he decided to make an "escape environment" for the these homeless people. He was given premises on Norfolk Street at a peppercorn rent in which people could feel safe, contact their families if they wished, access services

and hopefully get away from using "alcohol as a crutch". The Centre has "gone from strength to strength" and now even provided day trips such as one to Cleethorpes recently. The Forum Festival Week donation will definitely go to keep the centre going.


Many thanks Joe Castle

he deadline of the application for the proposed change of use for the Plough inn site, that still has an "Asset of Community Value" attached to it, was extended to 23rd July, it will now be submitted to the Sheffield Council Planning committee in September.

Cllr Anne Murphy and others were visiting this iconic building when a load of rubble from one of the owner's other sites (off Ecclesall Road) was brought to be dumped on this site. Things got rather heated when Anne had asked to see their waste

licence, with abusive language from the lorry driver

threatening to get "Mr Platt" (the owner) on the phone -Anne said she'd love to speak to him - we have been trying to contact him without success!

The visit at that time was because Lindsay Tolson a great great great grandson of Tom Armitage (Plough landlord from 1870s), was there. Tom had played cricket for Hallam Cricket Club (and also for England) the first recognized England World Test cricketer! So there is still a great deal of history attached to the site.

The 'Look North' TV programme team were also there filming, and cricket was in play on the pitch.
