BRITISH TELEVISION SERIES SET IN CROSSPOOL

3/ Car boot sale had decent weather (15th June), precinct flags went up on 23rd June & will stay for the Paris Olympics..

4/ Year 7 KES pupils planted up all the flowers for the precinct on 13rd June – thank you!

5/ Monthly litter picking taking place – new table bought for the team...

6/ New tables also bought by the Forum for the CDYST (one) & Benty Lane scouts (two).

7/ Work has finally started on the Motorworld site (6 units to be built) & empty Varanasi Inntaken back into the owner's hands.

8/ The death of Sandra Cox, Manchester Rd resident; a member of the Forum Management Committee, has been sadly announced.

TREASURER'S REPORT.

Provisionally the Fayre made £300 towards Forum funds, & Festival about £1200 to go to its chosen charities -Assist Sheffield & Medecins sans Frontieres. All those involved were formally thanked & names Minuted. (Sally Turnbull – Festival nominal chair & secretary – is standing down – please contact the Forum if you'd like to be involved next year). Jenny Hill & Jo Richards took over decorating this unique Sandygate Rd feature in 2019, & to date have produced 24 different displays to mark eg Christmas, summer, the Queen's Jubilee & King Charles' coronation – now the Paris Olympics. Look out for some of the past designs to appear as cards available from Charisma - & possibly in the 2025 calendar! POLICE REPORT

A gang of lads on electric bikes has been doing the rounds looking to target local properties – please phone 999 immediately if seen. The Police are eager to have any CCTV camera shots of them.

COUNCILLORS' QUESTIONS & REPORT -

1/ Safety? Residents asked about why there is no budget to allow PCSOs to patrol in the evenings? Answer – the numbers of PCSOs has gone up but more are being recruited – & Alan Billings when in office went above & beyond to attract more officers – many of which are now fully trained as police but possibly working behind the scenes - . cyber crime etc..

2/ Shop lifting – Spar &Tesco? . Although some shop assistants have been given bodycams they

have not received the training to go with these!

3/ Parking?. Amazingly the very successful Operation Park Safe has been pulled. The police say they would need 8 more officers to process all the tickets sent out! (Pavement parking in the city centre is now banned)

4/ Precinct builders' vans etc on DYLs? The residents need to ask for a 2 week parking warden operation to target shop workers using the shoppers' car parking bays & DYL parking.

5/ Good quality drone purchase?. Sadly a recent meeting between councillors & the S Yorks Crime Panel appeared to show the police were not keen on providing one.

6/ The new PCC (Mayor Oliver Coppard) will be asked to make more PCSOs & evening shift

work part of his next year plan..

7/ The responsibilities of the Highways Dept were brought to Councillors' attention – they have powers to enforce eg unmarked street skips & overhanging hedges. Is there no longer a Council officer with these responsibilities? (Fixmystreet does work as an avenue to report problems & get action).

8/ Amey has moved repair work expected in June to late August – Lydgate Lane & Benty Lane etc.

CLLR ANNE MURPHY MEMORIAL

John D. updated the meeting on this. The stonework (plaque wording& now a carved owl to represent our famous 'Crossie of Lydgate Lane) is underway at Stoneface – Loxley sculptor & stonemason & will be erected at Lydgate Green, as part of the housing for a much-needed water tap.

It's crucial to report even seemingly minor incidents, as they contribute to the overall analysis of crime reports, which in turn influences resource allocation and police response strategies. Not every report may lead to an officer's visit, but collectively, they help form a comprehensive picture of local issues, allowing for a more effective police response. Additionally, for those wishing to report anonymously, Crimestoppers offers a confidential service, accessible via phone 0800 555 111 or crimestoppers-uk.org online form, ensuring that everyone has the opportunity to contribute to the safety of their community without revealing their identity.

the vault. This achievement, I am extremely proud of. My experience has been incredible, giving me lifelong memories. From the support, encouragement and generosity of local people, clients at Aspects of Beauty, family, a couple of celebrities and an official sponsor from my home county of Ken (www.completefamilylawltd.co.uk), to my fellow teammates, the build-up of all the training sessions, the social media posts, the Radio and TV interviews, right up to the moment I put on my Great Britain tracksuit suit and leotard. It's been dreams come true. At 45 years old, a mum of two and owner of Aspects of Beauty, I never, in million years thought I'd be the Masters British gymnastic champion and a member of Team GB". 

We are hoping to start a monthly early afternoon café at the St Columba's Church site which will be open to the whole community, especially aimed to be a warm and friendly space for those living alone, those with memory issues and others who wish to engage with and support them. 

It's about getting maximum use of what you have, and enjoying every last drop. Getting more bang for your buck. Can your empty bottle be used as a refillable watering reservoir in a planter Can the empty compost bag be used as a potato sack Can you gift your unwanted wardrobe on Freecycle

A task before the next Clarion is for you notice when action to produce no waste accrues additional benefit. (Hint, summer is growing season, but what do you use to grow the plants)

How long have you had the Sausage Business in Crosspool?

* I think we had the building from May 2022 but opened August of that year. It took a long time to convert the space as we did most of it ourselves.

How is business going?

* OK, I think. We're getting new customers at the shop all the time and wholesale has been steadily increasing.

How many staff do you have?

* Currently 2 part time staff on sausage production. Kez helps out on a Wednesday and a Thursday, and Paul is my Saturday boy (he's actually a year older than me).

Do you employ local people?

* Yeah, Paul and Kez are both local but I am also on the lookout for casual staff for washing up/serving. I am also looking to take on an apprentice.

What makes "your produce special?"

* I use the best ingredients I can source and I'm fanatical about technique.

What are your best sellers at the moment?

* Käsekrainer, an Austrian style smoked sausage with Emmental cheese goes very well. My pork and pepper sausages also prove popular and we only use single origin pepper like Sarawak.

Any plans for the future?

* I'd like to open more days and build a bigger retail cliental.

Do you think local business is good for the community?

* Of course, people talk to each other and have a laugh in my shop. Many customers bend over and telling me I should write more labels.

What do you think about people using local shops?

* Well, it's down to us shopkeepers to provide what people want or at least offer the best of what we do. I think buying local is hard for some people who might be time and/or cash poor though.

What do you like about Crosspool?

* It's my home. A lovely place to raise a family.

What do you think of the summer display in the precinct?

* Very thoughtful and eye-catching as usual. Would like to see a sausage shaped flower display though!

What has been your favourite moment so far?

* I get them all the time when customers tell me how much they enjoyed their meal. Also seeing people eat a pastry, I'll never tire of seeing people really enjoy their food.

What would you like to see improve around the precinct?

* I think shoppers and business owners would generally like better parking. But that's not the way we're going as a society. A fully pedestrianised Crosspool would be really amazing for many reasons too.

Any general comments?
