

OPEN MEETING BULLET POINTS—THURSDAY 31ST JULY 2025

St Columba's Church; 7pm

Present; Ian Hague (Chair); Steve Reynolds (Vice Chair) (minutes); John Drinkwater (Treasurer); Nick Duggan; Sylvia Feeney. Guests; Kilvinder Vigurs Deputy Mayor of Police and Crime SYMCA; Katie Dearnley SYMCA; Cllr Minesh Parekh; Cllr Tim Huggan; PCSO Pam Thompson. Plus Crosspool residents Apologies; Cllr Ruth Milsom; Roger Kite.

Chair Ian Hague opened the meeting by welcoming attendees and introducing the top table and inviting guests. The minutes from 24th April 2025 were swiftly reviewed and approved, with no matters arising. The agenda was slightly rearranged to allow our guest speaker Kilvinder Vigurs to speak earlier, due to a prior commitment.

Guest Speaker:- Kilvinder Vigurs, Deputy Mayor for Policing and Crime, expressed her pleasure at attending and shared that she had recently taken office on 2nd June 2025. Her first eight weeks involved visiting communities across South Yorkshire to understand their varying needs, highlighting how priorities differ widely depending on location.

With over 30 years' experience in the criminal justice system, including roles in public protection, safeguarding, organised crime, and security, Kilvinder emphasized her commitment to rehabilitation, community engagement, and reducing crime. Her priorities include: Protecting children from cybercrime: Addressing antisocial behaviour and road safety. Tackling the impact of irresponsible e-bike and scooter use, reducing shoplifting, supporting youth, who often feel unheard and building public trust in policing.

Q&A Highlights:- City Centre Safety? Increased police visibility and Home Office funding for hotspot areas are under consideration. Neighbourhood Policing? Efforts are underway to grow community-facing teams. Public Awareness? A South Yorkshire Police staff member urged greater visibility of ongoing initiatives. PCSO Powers, concerns were raised over limited powers and pathways to full police roles? Nearly 75% of reported issues are community rather than police matters, clear reporting channels were encouraged. Road Safety Issues across Sandygate Road, Manchester Road, Selborne Road and others were raised, including speeding, crossings, and pavement parking. Kilvinder committed to working with teams on strategic improvements. Traffic Measures, residents discussed reinstating the Park Safe campaign and the possibility of installing traffic lights at Manchester Road/Sandygate Road junction. Kilvinder pledged to return to a future meeting with updates on progress.

Ian Hague thanked Kilvinder and Katie Dearnley for their time and wished them well

Chairman's Report:- Ian Hague shared local updates from the past three months. Crosspool Ghost Sign: Preservation planning is progressing, with artist appointments underway. Spar Shop: A warm welcome was extended to the new proprietor. Carver Fields: Yorkshire Water has begun site surveys and notified nearby residents. Youth Club: Now running Tuesdays at the Scout Hut, 5–7pm. Crosspool Videos: Available via the Forum website and Jack Todhunter's YouTube—well worth a watch. Festival and Fayre: Both events were a great success. Ian thanked the festival organisers. VE Day Flags remained in place in the precinct through the festival. Car Boot Sales, Well-attended in June. The next car boot sale is Saturday 6th September 8am Tavern car park. King Edward pupils helped with planting up precinct planters; hanging baskets and planters look blooming good. Lydgate Green Volunteers' efforts are very much appreciated—thank you!

Popular Groups:- Tuesday Easy Exercise, Wednesday Tai Chi and Friday Morning Art Group are going strong. Clarion autumn edition due mid-August.

Canal Cruise, expressions of interest invited. Pie & Pea Supper set for 5th September.

The Forum welcomes new members keen to make a difference.

Treasurer's Report:-John Drinkwater provided a financial update for the quarter. Thanks to successful fundraising, the Forum will donate over £820 to each of two local charities, both expressed their appreciation and gratitude. With event planning workload increasing, volunteers are encouraged to step forward and support future initiatives.

Police Liaison:- PCSO Pam Thompson echoed earlier discussions, reporting a 36% drop in burglaries compared to last year. However, public perception remains slanted by media coverage.

Recent incidents include: - 2 burglaries- An e-bike theft- Parcel stolen from a porch.

Residents are reminded to Register e-bikes for easy recovery - Use doorbell CCTV - Report incidents via the police website - Referred to local posters on crime prevention and safety

Councillors' Updates:- Cllr. Minesh Parekh Carver Fields: YWA is drilling nine boreholes to monitor groundwater levels. Site closures will last approx. 3–4 weeks, followed by 6–8 weeks of data collection. Site visits by project managers are planned: Tues 13th Aug, 1–3pm - Mon 19th Aug, 9.30–11.30am

Cllr. Tim Huggan – Bus Timetables: Changes from 31st August include permanent alterations to services 52 and 120. Updates on route 51 are pending.

Crookes Cemetery Concerns:- Funding options for repairing broken headstones are being explored. Security measures such as CCTV are also under review.

The Plough Site:- Planning is approved but development has stalled. The Council has limited leverage to accelerate progress.

PASSING OF A FOOTBALL TRAILBLAZER

A somber moment as we reflect on the passing of Uriah Rennie, a true pioneer in football and a cherished figure at Hallam FC. His contributions to

the sport and his commitment to fostering inclusivity will be remembered with deep respect.

Uriah Rennie made a lasting impact on Hallam FC, both as a trailblazer in football and a dedicated supporter of the club. He became Honorary President of Hallam FC in 2010, coinciding with the club's 150th anniversary. His leadership and guidance were deeply valued at Sandygate, where his presence and counsel helped shape the club's direction.

Beyond Hallam FC, Rennie was a pioneer in English football, famously serving as the first Black referee in the Premier League, officiating over 300 matches. His influence extended into grassroots football, where he championed inclusion and community engagement.

His contributions to Hallam FC and the wider football community will be sorely missed, but his legacy as a leader, mentor, and advocate for diversity in sport will continue to inspire future generations.





YORKSHIRE WATER STORM ALLIANCE SURVEY AT CALVER FIELDS

Yorkshire Water are delivering their largest ever environmental investment programme, with £8.3bn set to be invested across the region over the next five years to upgrade infrastructure and improve services for their customers

As part of Yorkshire Water's wider environmental investment programme, £1.5 billion is being

allocated to upgrading the network across Yorkshire to help reduce reliance on storm overflows. To support this initiative, ground investigation work is taking place at Carver Fields to assess which areas may be suitable for potential underground improvements to the network. On Wednesday 13 August, their partners Ward & Burke began carrying out ground investigation work on Carver Fields to see if this area would be suitable for one of their underground solutions. These tests will help them



- Understand ground water levels and pressures on the site.
- Identify whether or not the site is suitable for their proposed underground plans

The work involves closing specific areas of the field for around 3-4 weeks to drill nine boreholes, each around 20cm wide in different parts of the site. Once complete the holes will be covered and the team will return to carry out weekly visits to monitor the ground water conditions for around 6-8 weeks. Once this monitoring is complete the covers will be removed and the holes will be safely backfilled.

Normal working hours will be Monday to Friday from 8am - 5pm on occasion they may need to work a little later, however we will always try to inform you in advance of any out of hours working.

They won't need access into your home as part of this work, please remember to always ask for identification before letting anyone into your home.

The aim? To improve river health by reducing the use of storm overflows, making a cleaner, greener Crosspool for generations to come.


